Our programs emphasize applied knowledge and experiential learning, while developing a wider remit of competencies including conflict resolution, interpersonal communication and research and scholarship.

Central to the success of the JIBC's vision of being a world leader in justice and public safety education are our instructional faculty. Experiential and applied learning can only occur if our faculty possess the practical and expert knowledge of field practitioners. In addition, they must also have and exhibit a firm understanding of teaching, learning, and adult education.
