Position Summary:

The Fire & Safety Division (FSD) delivers superior public safety training using experienced and subject matter expert industry specialists, fire fighters/officers who instruct and evaluate in a variety of firefighting programs. Our instructors facilitate course delivery to the public, industry as well as to volunteer, composite, and career fire departments. FSD requires additional subject matter expert industry specialists, fire fighters/officers, from Vancouver Island to instruct at the Otter Point Fire Training Center, who are able to work as sessional instructors in delivering Live Fire training. The successful candidates will reflect the diversity of the fire service.

Sessional instructors are required in the following program areas:

- Live Fire 1 & 2

Primary Responsibilities:

- Teach/instruct JIBC Live Fire (1&2) Curriculum safely to students.
- Perform student evaluations.
- Provide written and verbal feedback to the students.
- Document student progress for student records.
- Convey training concerns from students to the Program Manager.
- Assist students with remediation, when required.

Qualifications & Requirements:

Candidates applying for these positions will have an established reputation and proven record in the emergency service industry, including the skills and abilities necessary to instruct the curriculum. Candidates are required to have recognized training and educational credentials equivalent to one level above the content area. A suitable combination of education and experience may be considered. Candidates must also meet the following requirements:

- NFPA 1001 Firefighter Level II- JIBC certified (ProBoard/IFSAC) or an equivalent combination of training and experience;
- Fire Service Instructor level I;
- Completion of the JIBC Evaluator Course (FIRE 1052);
- Minimum of 3-5 years of teaching experience, preferably with supervisory experience;
- High level of proficiency with using computer software as support tools in delivering instruction, such as Outlook, Excel, Word, and PowerPoint, and the internet;
- Willingness to assume leadership roles;
- Ability to work within a dynamic team in an exciting environment;
- Commitment to a collaborative and innovative approach to education;
- Excellent written and oral communication, interpersonal skills, and a desire to share knowledge with others.
- A positive attitude along with a proven track record and reputation in fostering positive and healthy relationships when teaching and training of volunteer fire department members.

Additional Desired Qualifications

- NFPA 1021 Fire Officer 1- JIBC certified (or an equivalent combination of training and experience)
- Fire Service Instructor level 2
- Experience in delivering live fire training and/or familiar with NFPA 1403 practice
- Provincial Instructor Diploma or professional development program would be an asset
- Curriculum development experience

All successful candidates must reside on Vancouver Island within a commutable distance to the Otter Point Fire Training Centre and be available to instruct/teach a minimum of six courses per year.
